

Rongoa Maori: Traditional Maori Medicine

Rongoa Maori: traditional Maori medicine/healing is developed in a Maori cultural context and aims to understand the events leading to ill health and its impacts. Treatments are culturally bound and include rakau rongoā (native flora herbal preparations), mirimiri (massage) and karakia (prayer).

Over the 20 years that these workshops have been running, the biggest challenge to keeping alive the knowledge, traditions, and practice of rongoa Maori (traditional Maori medicine) is that today most people don't live close to the ngahere (the bush); they live in cities and towns. They haven't had the chance to learn rongoa in the world in which it developed and belongs. That can make learning about rongoa a struggle.

This programme has been developed to address that challenge. The whole series is run in the ngahere. The aim is to teach people:

- how to identify the plants used for rongoa,
- where to find them, and how to collect them,
- the tikanga that must be followed.

There is a lot to learn. This is a step by step journey over a series of weekends to give participants a good foundation to learn rongoa Maori in a way that upholds and treasures the matauranga (traditional knowledge) of rongoa that has passed down over many centuries.

Rongoa Maori Handbook:

Rongoa Maori 1

This is the beginning of the journey. It introduces participants to the world of rongoa Maori, and the tikanga involved in learning rongoa. It focuses on getting to know the ngahere (the bush), how to identify the plants and trees that grow there, and the tikanga (traditional practices) that must be followed in harvesting from the ngahere for rongoa. It also puts participants in touch with resources and techniques, both traditional and current, to help them retain what they are learning, and to make use of it in a practical way.

Rongoa 4 - Medicine Manufacture Weekend:

The rongoa manufacturing workshop is offered to demonstrate the making of rongoa for use with friends and family.

The manufacturing course will cover: a review of the principles of rongoa Maori; do's and don'ts and why of harvesting; storage and manufacturing; ethics; using rakau for rongoa and kai; making ointments, balms, creams, infusions, and decoctions based on rongoa principles; introduction to other rongoa applications including poultices, compresses, syrups, plasters etc; reflections on our responsibilities; care of the knowledge and safety.

This is an interactive weekend that encourages student participation and sharing of knowledge and experiences. The prerequisite for enrolment is having completed at least Rongoa Maori 2.

Rongoa Maori 2 & 3:

These follow on from, and build on, Rongoa 1. As well as continuing to develop knowledge of tikanga and plant identification skills, the focus is increasingly on the harvesting and preparation of rongoa and their uses, and the care of ngahere (bush) itself to ensure that rongoa continues to be available.

These two courses are fully catered. As such, refunds are unavailable if you cancel less than five days before the course start date.
